THE COMPLETE METALSMITH takes a somewhat unusual approach to the material it presents. Unlike most books that progress from basic to advanced techniques, information has been arranged here according to the process involved. For example, you'll find all the information about holding things together, from simple tabs to sophisticated granulation is grouped in the chapter called *Joining*. In most cases each technique is confined to a single page. This makes it easy to get a quick overview of the nature of the process. The wire binding will allow the book to lay flat and take up only a little room on your bench top.

Dark rectangles along the edge of each page will guide you to the correct chapter. These may be augmented by adding your own index tabs at the beginning of each chapter or on frequently used pages. Buy plastic sleeves from an office supply store or cut the chapter heading tabs on the next page and glue one at the opening of each chapter.
